

COURSE OF STUDY OF GERMAN LAW

The Dutch speaking Brussels Bar (NOAB), the Deutscher Anwaltverein (DAV) and the Centre for Professional Legal Education of the Radboud University, the Netherlands (CPO) jointly organise a Course of study of German law in 2017 and 2018. This course offers a unique chance to acquire in-depth knowledge of German law on a variety of law topics such as contract law, insolvency law, employment law, tax law and company law. The different modules are taught by German attorneys and professors, who are all experts in their respective fields.

Target group

The course has been specifically developed to target the training needs of lawyers working at law firms (advocates), as well as those working for companies or any other interested persons, who have recently made their first steps onto the German market – or are planning on taking this step – and consequently have to deal with German clients and counterparts. Prior knowledge of German law is not required to be able to participate in the courses.

Programme

The course consists of 5 modules. Each module comprises 2 days and is dedicated to 2 different legal topics. Participants can either participate in the entire course, or choose to follow separate modules. The course language is German.

Credits

Belgian lawyers can apply for credits of continuous education per module or for the entire programme. Participants are invited to submit their attendance certificates to the appropriate authorities or to the President of the Bar association.

Location

The modules are alternatively taught in Amsterdam (WTC) and in Brussels (premises of the Dutch speaking Brussels Bar (NOAB), Regentschapsstraat 63, -1).

Dates

The modules will take place in May and November 2017 and in spring 2018.

Language

The course language is German. Participants whose knowledge of German is only passive can ask their questions and engage in discussions in English.

Registration fee

Price of the complete module is EUR 2860. Modules can be followed separately for the price of EUR 572 each. The price includes course materials and lunch.
